

EXCEPTIONAL MEDICAL / SOCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

Request for consideration under the Medical/Social criterion for admission to a Barnet community primary school

All schools have experience in dealing with children with additional needs. However, in a few very exceptional cases, there may be a reason why a child needs to attend a particular school.

Priority for admission to a Barnet community primary school may be given to children with an exceptional medical or social need that the school is particularly able to meet

Children with Special Educational Needs (SEN) will not be considered under the Medical/Social criterion as their needs require special provision and a separate process will be followed

To apply under the Medical/Social criterion you must:

1. Submit an application for a school place (full details about how to apply are on our website at www.barnet.gov.uk/schooladmissions)
2. Complete the attached form*
3. Provide independent professional evidence*

* if you are applying for a Reception 2022 place you must submit the form and your supporting evidence by 15 January 2022 or your request will not be considered until after National Offer Day.

When you complete the attached form, you will need demonstrate that there is a very specific connection between your child's needs and the school.

Your supporting evidence must include a current letter from a doctor, social worker or other appropriate professional, which names the particular school and specifies the reasons why it is necessary for your child to attend the school. The supporting letter must also make it clear what difficulties would be faced if your child attends an alternative school.

Evidence relating to the social or medical circumstances of the parent can be considered, but only if this impacts on the child and their need to attend a specific school. Requests may not be considered if long-term mobility issues are cited and you have not applied to your closest school.

Please note that the following are unlikely to be considered grounds for exceptional medical/social needs:

- speech & language delay
- use of a hearing aid
- child is awaiting an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- asthma, diabetes, eczema, travel sickness or allergies
- dispensing medication that may require some training as this can be undertaken by the school
- the need for a child to stay in friendship groups
- family attending the same school
- child attends the nursery
- childcare arrangements
- short term mobility issues

If you feel that one of these examples should be considered, you will need to prove how this has a significant impact on your child and why only the particular school can meet your child's exceptional need.
