Small businesses play an important part in achieving a sustainable future and our ambitions to become a net zero carbon borough by 2042. They reduce reliance on cars, encourage people to buy locally, offer a local, more personalised service and build community relationships.



What your business can do

Explore sustainable options: Look at how your business could change small things – LED lightbulbs, water saving taps, use less paper or single-use plastics. They all help.

Team effort: Ask your staff to share their ideas for supporting sustainability and the community involved in the business and at home.

Build relationships: Take time to talk to customers, learn what they want and encourage them to shop locally. It will also help you to reduce waste as you stock products that will sell.

Know your high street: Don't do it all by yourself. Become familiar with other businesses nearby. You can direct customers there boosting their footfall. It shows your business is helpful, knowledgeable and part of the community.

Reduce waste: Join the circular economy. Look at apps like Olio¹ or Too Good To Go² for passing on surplus food.

Take part: Keep an eye out for community projects that your business can support. Show you are committed to your neighbourhood.

Hashtag it: Use local hashtags in your social media posts.



What you can encourage your customers to do

Bring your own: Encourage customers to use reusable bags, cups or containers. Offer a discount or other incentive when they do.

Spread the word: Remind customers to tell people that they shop with you. It's not boasting – you're getting the word out about local businesses.

Leave the car at home: Encourage them to walk or take the bus. Could you offer a delivery service for bulky or heavy purchases?

Keep you up to date: Ask them to tell you about any community initiatives. There may be projects that you could help to support and will help increase your local business profile.
